Memorial tribute to Adrian Kuiters 70 Years young!

Adrian died 14th June 2022.

Doing what he loved best! Riding his bike!

Adrian joined our club on 25 February 2003, Member No. 132.

Before Adrian retired he was a part time fire-fighter at Saratoga.

Adrian had a passion for motorbikes, riding and restoring them, and helping friends sort out bike problems that only Adrian knew how to do, nothing was too much trouble. He was always smiling, happy and a very proud man. His bikes were always spotless, including his car garage and his hideout, which was his home away from home (his shed) with all the creature comforts including air Conditioner, 52inch TV, and a workbench full of tools that made a difficult job a lot easier.

Adrian was a member of The Gods Squad a Christian riding group where he made lifelong friends Ray Spence and Henning Jorgensen. The God Squad was formed to talk to bike members about God and life.

Adrian owned "Yellow Terror" a1970 R60/5 BMW sidecar now on show at Nabiac Museum in rugged patina. He also owned a 1950's 250cc BMW sports bike R27, a 250ccs R25 BMW totally restored and a late model original BMW 1200cc GS which was fully kitted out. He also owned his pride and joy, a BMW Outfit R60/5 sidecar bike that he and his friend Henning reconditioned 2 years ago the engine and gear box. Anyone would be proud to own any of his bikes!

Henning told me that Adrian, in the old days, had a 1942 Harley Davidson 750cc with sidecar WLA (which stands for War Lease Australia, whatever that is supposed to mean). Adrian had a soft spot for that bike and he loved a challenge. He was always working on it!

Adrian ran "The Sidecar Rally" for many years which was held on the Bridle Trail between Bathurst and Hill End. Adrian went on many Rally's. The Alpine Rally ride was one of his favourites. Adrian was getting ready for a Vintage bike rally to be held on the following weekend, so Adrian went on a test ride on his recently done up BMW 250cc sports on Sunday morning, and while riding, he had a medical episode and went off into the bush just past the four ways intersection going up the hill on the way to Kulnura. If you are passing by give him a nod!!

Many thanks to Tim Corlett and Dale Bax for being there at the accident scene.



Peter Redman interviews Mark Gattenhof

- Q: Where were you born?
- A: Mater Misericordia Hospital, North Sydney.
- Q: Did you have a nickname?
- A: At school I was called "Pop" In the Army I was called "Gatty".
- Q: Where did you grow up?
- A: Kirribilli, Ryde, Auburn and Hunter's Hill.
- Q. Where did you work?
- A: After leaving school I worked as a Junior Clerk in a Lift Engineering firm at Chippendale. In 1962 I joined the NSW Railways as a Junior Station Assistant at Artarmon where I met my (now) wife, Merrilyn. I progressed through the various grades in the Traffic Branch. In 1975 I transferred to the Safety Section and finished up in 1991 as the Senior Safety Officer, Northern Region at Newcastle.

Comment: Mark is supported in life and his club activities by his wife, Merrilyn.

- Q: Did you serve in the Military?
- A: In 1966 I was conscripted for two years compulsory Army service. I was discharged in 1968 and joined the Citizen Military Forces (CMF) now Army Reserve, in 1969. I was finally retired from the Army in 2012 after 46 years' service with the rank of Warrant Officer Class 2.
- Q: When did you start riding?
- A: In 1970.
- Q: What was your first motorcycle?
- A: 1970 Honda CB 175.
- Q: What other motorcycles have you owned?
- A: 1974 Honda CB 350, 1970 Triumph ex-Police Saint (currently being restored), several James two-strokes, four BMWs, 1990 Enfield 350cc Bullet, 1948 125cc Acme, 2001 Triumph Bonneville and a 1971 Triumph 250cc Blazer.
- Q: What is your favourite motorcycle?
- A: Triumph for sure!
- Q: When did you join the CCCMCC?
- A: I was the Foundation President (1983) of our previous club, the Central Coast Branch of the Classic & Enthusiasts MCC NSW. In 1988 we started up the CCCMCC.
- Q: What positions have you held in CCCMCC?
- A: How much paper have you got? President (2003), Treasurer (2008-14), President (2015-20), Secretary (Current) and Registrar.
- Q: What other Interests/hobbies do you have?
- A: I am the Secretary for the Association of 17th Infantry Battalions and a Legatee with Brisbane Water (NSW) Legacy Club. I also have a life-long interest in model railways, but lack the space to build my dream layout.



And so it goes......



This time I waited 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ hours for a tow and finally got the bike home only to discover a pin hole leak on the underside of the fibreglass fuel tank. So it goes.

I emptied and removed the tank, flipped it over and smeared some detergent where I thought the pin hole was, I then put my compressed air blow gun on the fuel tap to put some slight air pressure in the tank whilst I looked for bubbles. Bang! The tank seam split open!







Welcome to the 37th Annual Pelican Rally

On 9/10/11 September 2022

We are excited to announce a new venue for our 37th Annual Pelican Rally at the beautiful Norah Head Holiday Park. Our club has been hosting the Pelican Rally since 1983. The purpose of the rally is to provide a venue for the gathering of Veteran, Vintage and Classic motorcycles of all makes. This year will see our 37th gathering. Over the years there have been some magnificent machines displayed and ridden on the Pelican.

The 1st Pelican was based at the Gosford Waterfront in the boat ramp car park. We had 44 bikes entered ranging from a 1911 Triumph to a 1983 Honda VF750F. When we held our Bi-Centennial Pelican in 1988 we had over 200 bikes in attendance! Other venues included Mount Penang Boys Home and Gosford Showground. In 1996 Old Sydney Town (OST) became "home" to the Pelican Rally. Unfortunately, owing to a disastrous fire at OST in March 2014, we lost our "home".
